# OUR OPPONENTS

## BARRY TOWN UNITED



# HISTORY

## **Formation & Early Years (1892–1914)**

Founded as Barry and Cadoxton District in 1892, the club played under several names before becoming Barry AFC in 1912. Townsfolk built Jenner Park for their Southern League debut in 1913, where they beat Mid-Rhondda 2–1 in front of 4,000 fans. Football halted during WWI, with club captain Major James Wightman among the war's casualties.

## **Southern League Era (1920–1939)**

Barry's finest early achievement came in 1920–21, winning the Southern League (Welsh Section), narrowly missing out on Football League entry. The club remained in the Southern League for 60+ years, boasting legendary players like Dai Ward, Fred Whitlow and Johnny Gardner. They enjoyed memorable FA Cup runs and introduced floodlights at Jenner Park in 1949.

## **Post-War Highlights (1949–1980s)**

Barry lifted their first Welsh Cup in 1955, defeating Chester City. The club also hosted future stars and welcomed continental talents from Scandinavia. After leaving the Southern League in 1982, Barry dominated the Welsh League through the 1980s.

## **Exile & Return (1990s)**

In 1992, new FAW rules forced Barry out of the English system. The club briefly played in exile before returning to Welsh League Division One in 1993–94. Their comeback sparked an unprecedented golden era.

## **Decade of Dominance (1994–2003)**

Barry became Wales' first fully professional club, winning multiple titles and cups, including the Welsh Cup and League of Wales championship. They enjoyed European nights against Dynamo Kiev, Aberdeen, Porto and others—becoming the first Welsh side to win a Champions League tie in 2001–02.

## **Decline & Crisis (2003–2010)**

Financial woes saw the club enter administration in 2003. Star players left, and Barry fielded an amateur team from the South Wales Amateur League. Despite passionate fan efforts, off-field turmoil—including controversial ownership and ground relocations—led to the club's lowest-ever league standing.

## **Fan-Led Revival (2010–2013)**

Fans, under the Barry Town Supporters Committee, took over operations amid ownership battles. Barry reached the Welsh Cup semi-final in 2013 and marked their centenary with notable events. However, FAW rejected their right to play, prompting legal action.

## **Survival & Resurgence (2013–Present)**

A High Court ruling reinstated Barry to Welsh League football. The fan-run club went on to win back-to-back league titles and re-established youth, women's and disability teams. In 2017, Barry returned to the JD Welsh Premier League—completing one of Welsh football's greatest comebacks.

# ONES TO WATCH

## BARRY TOWN



### IEUAN OWEN

FORWARD | 19 YEARS OLD | #9

Barry Town United fans have had plenty to be excited about with the emergence of young forward Ieuan Owen. The 19-year-old arrived at Jenner Park last summer after an impressive campaign with Afan Lido, where he netted 15 goals in the Cymru South. Making the step up to top-flight football, Owen has adapted quickly to life in the Cymru Premier, using his blistering pace and sharp movement to trouble defenders at every opportunity.

In his first season with the Town, Owen contributed a solid return of eight goals across all competitions, including some vital strikes in league and cup action. His ability to find space and stretch backlines has made him a key outlet in attack, and he's quickly become a fan favourite thanks to his tireless work rate and eye for goal.

Still in the early stages of his career, Ieuan is a player with bags of potential—and if his debut season in Barry colours is anything to go by, there's plenty more to come.

Keep an eye on No. 9 this evening—he's one to watch.



### OWEN CUDDIHY

LM / WB | 20 YEARS OLD | #21

A bright addition to Barry Town's squad midway through last season, Owen Cuddihy has brought real energy and intent to the left-hand side. Comfortable as both a winger and a full-back, Cuddihy offers versatility and athleticism that's been vital in recent months as Barry look to solidify their place in the top flight.

Since his arrival from Newport City in January, the 20-year-old has impressed with his willingness to take on defenders, accurate delivery from wide, and his smart link-up play in the final third. A tidy left foot and good engine make him a constant outlet—whether starting deep or pushing forward on the overlap.

Though not yet prolific in front of goal, Cuddihy has already made his mark with assists and dangerous crosses. His set-piece delivery adds another string to his bow, and with more game time under his belt, he looks set to play a key role this season on the flanks for Barry Town.

Look out for No. 21—a player full of running and always looking to make things happen.



## CALLUM SAINTY

MIDFIELD | 29 YEARS OLD | #4

One of the most experienced heads in the Barry Town United squad, Callum Sainty brings leadership, tenacity, and composure to the heart of midfield. Now in his third season at the club, Sainty has been a consistent performer, anchoring the middle of the park with his intelligent positioning and calm use of the ball.

Equally comfortable breaking up play as he is starting attacks, Callum's work often goes under the radar—but it's no surprise that Barry look more balanced and composed when he's on the pitch. His ability to dictate tempo and read the game makes him an invaluable presence, especially in tough fixtures where control in midfield is key.

Now approaching 30, Sainty is playing some of the most mature football of his career, and remains a vital part of the squad both on and off the field.

Watch out for No. 4 today—he may not always grab the headlines, but he'll be at the heart of everything Barry do.



## OLLIE HULBERT

ATTACKER | 23 YEARS OLD | #22

A constant threat in the final third, Ollie Hulbert has quickly become a standout figure in Barry Town United's attack. Signed in the summer of 2023, the 23-year-old forward made an immediate impact with his sharp movement, tireless running, and clinical finishing.

Comfortable playing through the middle or drifting wide, Hulbert brings real versatility to the front line. He's always looking to get in behind defences, and his natural instinct for goal makes him a danger whenever he's near the box. Whether it's a poacher's finish or a long-range strike, Ollie has the technique and confidence to take chances when they come.

Still young, but already a key part of Barry's attacking identity, Hulbert will be looking to build on an impressive debut season and take another step forward this campaign.

Eyes on No. 22 this afternoon—he only needs a yard to make something happen.







It would then be a debut goal from Alex Bonthron to make it four for the Reds. A skillful move from Tristan once again getting a cross into the box - this time towards the back post finding Alex who hit home.

# THE GARY LLOYD CUP



**T**he new JD Cymru Premier season gets underway in fitting style this afternoon, as Llanelli Town and Barry Town United meet at Stebonheath Park for Matchday 1 – and for the latest chapter in the Gary Lloyd Cup.

Contested whenever these two clubs face off in the league, the Gary Lloyd Cup celebrates one of the most respected and influential players in Welsh domestic football. Few players have made the kind of lasting impact Gary Lloyd has – both at club level and on the national stage.

Gary rose to prominence with Barry Town in the 1990s, becoming a key part of the club's all-conquering side that dominated the

League of Wales and competed regularly in Europe. With his trademark left foot, calm presence in defence and set-piece quality, Gary helped Barry to multiple league titles, domestic cup wins, and famous European ties.

Later, he joined Llanelli Town, where his experience proved vital during the Reds' most successful era – including the 2007/08 Welsh Premier League title win and multiple European appearances. His leadership and consistency at the back were hallmarks of both spells.

But perhaps Gary's most historic moment came in 1998, when he became the first player from the Welsh domestic league to receive a call-up to

the senior Wales national team while still playing in the League of Wales. Selected by Bobby Gould, it was a groundbreaking achievement that put the league on the map and opened the door for future talents.

With over 400 domestic appearances, international recognition, and silverware at both clubs, Gary's legacy is more than secure. This cup honours not just his contributions on the pitch, but the values of commitment,

professionalism, and passion he represented.

As both sides kick off the 2025/26 campaign, expect a hard-fought, high-quality contest – a fitting tribute to
