# HISTORY

**H**averfordwest County AFC, proudly known as The Bluebirds, are one of the oldest and best-loved clubs in Welsh football. Founded in 1899, the club has been a cornerstone of the sporting community in Pembrokeshire for well over a century. Their home, Bridge Meadow Stadium, has long been a hub for football in West Wales, a place where the town gathers to back its team.

The club's early years saw them compete in local and regional competitions, before joining the Welsh League in the 1930s. After the Second World War, Haverfordwest began to make their mark, gaining a reputation as a competitive and ambitious side. Success came in the form of league titles and strong cup runs, as the Bluebirds built a following far beyond the boundaries of their county town.

When the League of Wales was founded in 1992, Haverfordwest were not among the original 20 members, but promotion soon followed. Their first taste of top-flight football came in the early 1990s, and while the club would endure spells of relegation and promotion in the decades that followed, their determination to compete at the highest level has never wavered.

A golden chapter arrived in the 2003–04 season, when the Bluebirds, managed by former Wales international Deryn Brace, achieved their highest ever league finish of third place. That remarkable campaign brought with it a place in Europe for the very first time. In the summer of 2004, Haverfordwest represented Wales in the UEFA Intertoto Cup against Etzella Ettelbruck of Luxembourg. Although they were beaten over two legs, it marked a proud moment for the club, players, and fans, flying the flag for Pembrokeshire on the continental stage.

Relegation in 2011 was a setback, but the resilience of the Bluebirds shone through. They battled their way back into the Cymru Premier in 2015 and again in 2020, showing the club's determination to continually rise to the challenge. Their most recent era has been one of growth and rebuilding, with an emphasis on stability, community engagement, and youth development through their academy setup.

The 2022–23 season brought another turning point, as Haverfordwest finished 7th in the Cymru Premier but claimed a place in Europe via the play-offs after a dramatic penalty shootout victory against Newtown. That set the stage for their most successful European campaign to date.

In the 2023–24 UEFA Europa Conference League, the Bluebirds faced KF Shkëndija of North Macedonia in the First Qualifying Round. After a 1–0 defeat away, they responded with a superb 1–0 win at Cardiff City Stadium thanks to Jack Wilson's goal, before holding their nerve to win 3–2 on penalties. The reward was a tie against B36 Tórshavn of the Faroe Islands in the Second Qualifying Round. A 1–1 draw at home kept the tie alive, but a narrow 2–1 defeat after extra time away saw Haverfordwest eliminated 3–2 on aggregate – a run that remains the club's best ever European performance.

The Bluebirds returned to Europe again in the summer of 2025, meeting Floriana of Malta in the First Qualifying Round of the Conference League. After losing the first leg 2–0 away, they staged the return leg at Parc y Scarlets in Llanelli. Backed by a large following, Haverfordwest stormed into a 2–0 lead through Greg Walters and Ben Ahmun, only for Floriana to fight back and eventually win 3–2 on the night, 5–2 on aggregate. Despite the exit, it was another memorable occasion that showed just how far the club has come.

Under the stewardship of manager Tony Pennock, the club has embraced a modern, professional outlook while retaining its roots as a proud community team. Bridge Meadow continues to be a lively and welcoming home ground, hosting Cymru Premier football and serving as a focal point for football in West Wales.

From their foundation at the turn of the 20th century, through highs and lows in the national league, to their adventures on the European stage, Haverfordwest County's story is one of persistence, pride, and passion. The Bluebirds remain the beating heart of football in Pembrokeshire, carrying their history forward while continuing to write new chapters in the Cymru Premier.

# ONES TO WATCH HAVERFORDWEST

## COREY SHEPHARD

MIDFIELDER | 27 YEARS OLD | #8

At the heart of Haverfordwest County's midfield, Corey Shephard continues to be the player who keeps things ticking. The 27-year-old plays with intelligence, consistency, and a real understanding of the game—connecting defence to attack and giving the side shape and structure.

Shephard's positioning and decision-making make him hard to play through. He breaks up opposition moves with well-timed challenges, recycles possession smartly, and often makes the right pass under pressure. But there's more to his game than just doing the basics—when the moment's right, he's also capable of driving forward and opening things up with a pass or a burst through the middle.

Experienced at this level and trusted by the staff, Shephard is one of those players whose value isn't always in the highlights—but is always clear when you watch the game closely. His leadership, control and work rate in the middle of the park make him vital to how County operate.

Keep an eye on Corey Shephard this afternoon—the engine in midfield who does the hard work and sets the tempo.

## BEN FAWCETT

ATTACKER | 25 YEARS OLD | #9

A familiar face in the Haverfordwest attack, Ben Fawcett has grown into one of the club's most reliable and hard-working forwards in recent seasons. Quick, sharp, and always on the move, he brings constant energy to the front line—stretching defenders, chasing down loose balls, and offering an outlet whether the team is in or out of possession.

Fawcett is the type of player who gives defenders a tough afternoon. He presses aggressively from the front, times his runs well, and isn't afraid to get into the physical side of the game. He's capable of finishing off chances when they come, but just as importantly, he creates space and problems for others around him with his selfless movement.

Now 25 and a regular Cymru Premier presence, he's built a strong reputation for reliability and effort. For a team like County, who value work ethic and shape, Fawcett is a vital part of the system.

Keep an eye on Ben Fawcett this afternoon—lively, relentless, and always a danger on the break.

## ALARIC JONES

DEFENDER | 24 YEARS OLD | #5

Solid at the back and confident going forward, Alaric Jones continues to be one of Haverfordwest County's most dependable performers. A regular in the starting XI, the 24-year-old full-back plays with real purpose—offering width and energy down the right flank while keeping things disciplined defensively.

Jones has a good engine and reads the game well, allowing him to time his overlapping runs without leaving gaps behind. He's tidy on the ball, rarely flustered, and brings a level of consistency that makes him easy to build around. Whether it's locking down a tricky winger or providing the extra man in attack, he does the job without fuss—and often without headlines.

He's part of a growing core of young players at County who are helping drive the team forward with intensity, discipline and belief.

Watch out for Alaric Jones this afternoon—an assured presence on the right-hand side and a key link between defence and attack.

## RHYS ABBRUZZESE

DEFENDER | 26 YEARS OLD | #3

A modern full-back with real attacking intent, Rhys Abbruzzese continues to be one of Haverfordwest County's most consistent and dynamic performers. Comfortable bombing forward or locking things down at the back, the 26-year-old offers pace, energy, and composure on the ball—and is just as likely to be seen delivering a cross in the final third as he is making a crucial interception deep in his own half.

Abbruzzese brings strong experience to this County side, having previously represented Wales at youth international level and spent time with clubs including Cardiff City and Barry Town United. He reads the game well, rarely gives the ball away, and offers a reliable outlet down the left, whether building from deep or stretching the play wide.

A set-piece option and a natural leader, he's been a constant figure in the club's recent growth and remains one of the first names on the team sheet. His blend of work rate, intelligence, and attacking quality makes him one of the standout left-backs in the division.

Keep an eye on Rhys Abbruzzese this afternoon—solid at the back, dangerous going forward, and a key figure for County on both sides of the ball.

# LAST TIME OUT

Flint Town United 4 - O Llanelli Town  
JD Cymru Premier Matchday 13

Another tough visit to the Essity Stadium saw the Reds fall to defeat against a strong Flint Town United side.

Flint created the first big chance when Michael Burke's half-volley flashed right across the face of goal – a very close effort that had Alex Pennock beaten. The hosts continued to press and took the lead on 16 minutes after some neat one-two play between Jake Canavan and Carlos Mudimu, with Canavan's brilliant pass finding Jake Phillips, who squared across goal for Elliott Reeves to finish from close range.

Canavan was involved again soon after, his free kick cleared by Theo Wharton, with Ben Hughes' follow-up comfortably caught by Pennock. Another Flint chance saw a long free kick from Jake Phillips headed across goal by Mudimu, only for Reeves to send his header over the bar.

At the other end, Pennock's free kick from halfway caused problems, with Sean Cronin pressuring the defence before the ball fell to Sam Parsons, whose low strike forced a good save from Jack Flint. Flint went on to double their lead before





half-time when Isaac Lee showed great strength to drive into the box, setting up Reeves to fire into the top left corner. Lee almost made it three soon after, but Cronin was on hand to clear his effort off the line.

Early in the second half, Flint added a third when Burke found Canavan just outside the box, and his first-time strike flew into the bottom corner, giving Pennock no chance. Llanelli kept battling and came close when Brad Gibbings slipped a clever pass through to Danny Williams, but Jack Flint produced another excellent save to deny him.

Pennock made further stops to keep the scoreline down, saving well from Ben Hughes, but Flint sealed the win late on as Burke broke down the wing and found Josh Jones, who linked with Phillips before squaring for Reeves to smash home his hat-trick goal.

Flint almost grabbed a fifth late on when the ball fell kindly inside the box, but a moment of hesitation from Imariagbe allowed Harrison Bright to recover and make a vital block from six yards out. Another tough away day for the Reds, who will look to bounce back next weekend.



# REDS WOMEN REACH KNOCKOUT STAGES

Llanelli Town Women 3 - 2 Carmarthen Town Women  
Genero Adran Trophy

A big afternoon at Stebonheath Park saw Llanelli Town Women come out on top in the Carmarthenshire Derby, defeating newly promoted Carmarthen Town 4-2 to secure a historic place in the Genero Adran Trophy knockout stages for the first time.

It was a tough start for the Reds, who took time to settle as Carmarthen enjoyed the better of the early chances. The visitors took the lead after 21 minutes through Summer Evans, the lively attacking player showing her quality with a brilliant strike from distance that flew beyond Bethan Ellis and into the top corner. It was a goal of real class – and on current form, you wouldn't bet against a few Adran Premier sides keeping an eye on her progress.

Llanelli showed impressive character to respond. Rather than let the setback knock their rhythm, they stuck to the game plan and began to find their flow. On 31 minutes, Paige Crosby slipped a precise through ball to Ffion Varney, who made a clever run in behind and calmly opened her body to slot past the keeper





for 1–1. Varney, who has looked increasingly confident since scoring against Pure Swansea, was once again a constant threat.

Six minutes later, the Reds turned the game around. Crosby's pressing forced an error at the back, allowing her to race through and coolly finish to give Llanelli the lead. The home side continued to push forward, and on 42 minutes produced the game's standout moment. Making her first start for the club, 16-year-old Danni Webster picked up the ball well outside the box and struck it perfectly — a dipping, driven effort that flew over the goalkeeper and in off the underside of the bar. A spectacular goal from the youngster and one she'll certainly remember.

Carmarthen hit back early in the second half through Grace McDonald, who reacted quickest to a deflection in the box to make it 3–2 and briefly shift the momentum. But Llanelli held firm, managed the game well, and continued to look dangerous on the break. Their persistence paid off as they restored control and saw out the remaining stages with composure and grit to secure the win.

Thanks to results elsewhere — and having scored one goal more than Pure Swansea, with both sides level on points and goal difference — Llanelli progress to the Genero Adran Trophy knockout stages for the first time, where they will host Pontypridd United at Stebonheath Park on 9 November.
